Irregular Verbs

STUDENT OBJECTIVES

- · Identify irregular verbs.
- · Write the correct form of an irregular verb to show past tense.

Writing Tip

If you're not sure what the past-tense form of a verb is, look up the verb in a dictionary. Dictionaries show the past-tense form of all irregular verbs.

Examples		
Present	Past	
write eat buy take drive speak	wrote ate bought took drove spoke	

Teach/Model

Remind students that adding -ed to most verbs makes them past tense. However, some verbs form the past tense in a different way.

- Define irregular verb. An irregular verb is a verb that does not form the past tense by adding -ed. For example: Jackson usually wears sneakers, but today he wore boots. Explain that wear is an irregular verb.
- Give examples of familiar irregular verbs. For example, eat/ate; sing/sang; speak/spoke; think/thought.
- Write these examples on the board. Use the modeling to guide students to identify the correct form of irregular verbs.

Example	Model/Think Aloud
How many people <i>rode</i> their bikes yesterday?	Ride is an irregular verb. That means I can't just add -ed to it. The past tense of ride is rode.
Joe saw his brother make a goal.	See is an irregular verb. That means I can't just add -ed to it. The past tense of see is saw.
I heard the crowd roar!	Hear is an irregular verb. The sound of the letters ear is different in hear and heard.
